Summer roadway projects expected to begin early summer.

June 7, 2010 (Mountain Village, Colo.) – Summer is the season for road repairs in Mountain Village, and this summer is no exception. For 2010, the town's main roadway projects include crack filling, shoulder and drainage maintenance, lane striping, pothole patching and road resurfacing. As of late May, crews have begun to fill cracks as the prolonged winter/spring weather allows. Following this project, the town will begin shoulder and ditch maintenance and pothole patching. Some of this work must be finished before completely striping the roadways. However, the town will lay the center stripes on Mountain Village Boulevard as soon as temperatures permit.

As for this year's pothole patching plan, Road and Bridge staff will focus primarily on Mountain Village Boulevard, Country Club Drive, Visher Drive, and Yellow Brick Road, along with other various roadways where needed. This project will be ongoing throughout the summer and fall months, and traffic control will be in effect in these denoted areas during applicable times. With that, please be aware of and obey all traffic controllers for the sake of everyone's safety.

With regards to the more major of the roadways projects, this year the town will place a chip and seal, with a fog coating, on Adams Ranch Road, Benchmark Drive up to Rocky Road and San Joaquin Road. Recently, the town applied asphalt overlays to these main arterials, and with the chip and seal coating the asphalt surface will be protected for years to come. Please note, this project is scheduled for the latter part of July; the town will provide schedule information as it gets closer to the actual project start date.

Lastly, another major summer project affecting Mountain Village residents and guests as they travel and park in the Village this summer season is the sealing of the Gondola Parking Garage. Last year, an epoxy resin and aggregate seal coating was applied to the upper decks of the garage. For 2010, the town will complete the second phase of this project by coating the ramp up to the upper decks and half of level five's surface area. This project will take place in August with the unaffected parking decks, levels one through four, accessible to the public.

To end, please drive carefully and be aware of work crews along the roadways this summer season.
